The *Understanding ACEs: Building Self-Healing Communities* presentation is presented in three sections:

- 1) <u>Neurobiology & Epigenetics</u> focuses on how our brains adapt to our environment during childhood and some basic concepts related to how toxic stress impact healthy development.
- 2) <u>Key Findings from Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) study</u> highlights some of the data from the original ACE study.
- 3) <u>Resilience</u> provides a framework for thinking about resilience and focuses primarily on attachment and belonging, supporting individual capabilities, and culture, community, and spirituality as key protective systems.

After hearing the presentation, attendees are encouraged to stay on for an open group discussion on ways we can think creatively about how this information can be applied within their own "sphere of influence" (family, workplace, school, community, etc.).
