# I. Only notable information that requires top billing.

3/25/2020

- Gov Walz issued Executive Order directing Minnesotans to stay at home and limit movements outside of their homes beyond essential needs for two weeks
  - o Effective Friday March 27<sup>th</sup> at 11:59pm to Friday April 10<sup>th</sup>
  - o Bars, restaurants, public accommodation closure extends to May 1<sup>st</sup>
  - School closing extends to May 4<sup>th</sup>

# II. Local Update - Central - our five-county area

• 287 cases in Minnesota as of 3/25/2020. No new cases in Benton or Stearns. MDH has added a "recovered" section – 122 cases currently recovered. 35 total cases were hospitalized, currently 26 hospitalized – 12 in the ICU. Age range of positive cases is from 6 months to 94 years old.

- 287 cases in MN as of 3/25/2020. 1 death (confirmed 3/20/2020)
- No new cases in Benton 1 case
- MDH is now reporting number of completed tests from MDH, as well as the number of completed tests from external laboratories.
  - 6,365 approximate number of completed tests from MDH Public Health Lab
  - o 5,110 approximate number of completed tests from external labs
- Donation update
  - PPE Donation process will be coordinated through the City of St. Cloud (Lisa Braun) for Benton/Stearns and all CentraCare health systems
    - All calls re: donations go through the established local Benton/Stearns Hotline

- Adequate staffing capacity is supplied through Stearns and the City of St. Cloud at this time
- Other donations can be done through United Way or other regular community organizations
- CentraCare Situation Report
  - Quick Clinics closed
  - River Campus Clinic to become Acute Respiratory Clinic
    - River Campus will NOT be doing COVID-19 testing
    - This will not be a walk in clinic, must have an appointment
  - Regional Hospital Support Plan
    - Working with Wright County and Rice Memorial Hospital
- Emergency Workers Daycare Needs for children age infant to school age (age 4) school is still caring for those 5-12 years old
  - 0 1-888-291-9811
- Julie will follow up with updated guidance re: mortuary service
- Julie touched base with daycare providers
  - They are not currently having issues with purchasing quantities in grocery stores
  - School meal program eligible
- Outreach to Benton County Mental Health Supervisor
  - Sandi has heard updates from Mental Health providers and has not heard of increased demand at this time.
- Homelessness we are continuing to work on sheltering options for the homeless population for SIP if we need this
  - Working across Benton, Stearns, and Sherburne Counties for planning – plan is for the three Counties to work under the existing Stearns County contract
  - o PH from all three counties will coordinate essential services
  - o Planning for a tour tomorrow to assess the space
  - Requests for SIP here should go through the Benton/Stearns Hotline
  - o MDH is contracting with SCSU to turn dorms into hospital beds

- o Sam is updating the Hotline number to reflect donation calls
- Foley businesses (three stores) are distributing COVID-19 informational flyers
- Jenny is working with Sauk Rapids contact for distribution of flyers at Sauk Rapids businesses
- Fraudulent tests that are not approved by the FDA are being marketed – shared on social media
